WELCOME TO THE UXBRIDGE HISTORICAL CENTRE!

The Uxbridge Historical Centre is a cluster of 10 buildings in which the heritage of the Uxbridge area is collected, preserved, and displayed. We have a one-room schoolhouse, two period houses, a print shop, two former community halls, an implement shed, carriage shed, and barn.

Our museum is perfect for hosting class trips, with beautiful, spacious grounds, and a panoramic view of the town of Uxbridge and Oak Ridges Moraine.

Each of our programs is a half-day (two hours), however you can combine two programs of your choice to create a custom full-day program (5 hours) for your class! Every program incorporates a craft for the students to take home, and fun games played on the grounds. Teachers may also keep their class at the museum after the program to enjoy a picnic lunch and games on the grounds under their supervision.

We are currently booking school programs for the 2011/2012 school year. We are available to host programs for schools from September to October 2011, and May to June 2012. Summer programs are also available for children's groups and clubs, and Home School programs. Please contact us with any inquiries or requests.



DAY AT THE MUSEUM



In this program, students get the opportunity to tour the Historical Centre grounds and buildings, learning how people lived in the late 19th century in rural Ontario. The students will also get to travel back in time to attend a class in the schoolhouse. Students will make a vintage craft and play a pioneer game.

Learning about pioneer homes, schooling, farm equipment, tools, and household items can be more interesting and easier for the teachers at the Historical Centre, using authentic artifacts. LIFE: YESTERDAY AND TODAY



This program has students look at their daily lives-their community, home, school, entertainment, chores, travel, food, and health. By visiting the museum's village and seeing items from the past, students will be able to visualize how their life is different from children who lived in our community over 100 years ago!

TRAVEL, COMMUNICATION, AND PRINTING

Learn how pioneers travelled to settle here, through forests and rough trails, with the dangers involved in early travel. Students will learn how pioneers built "Corduoy Roads" and bridges, and travelled to church, school, and other towns. Students will also learn about how bells were used for communication in daily life. Through visiting our working print-shop, students will learn about early newspapers and their importance.



FOOD, HEALTH, AND MEDICINE

Learn about the food that pioneers ate, and how it was prepared and preserved. Visit an early country kitchen and see how meals were prepared without the use of electricity. Students will make and sample some home-made butter. Students will visit the Museum's herb garden and learn how people used trees, roots, and plants to cure minor illnesses. They will also learn about early doctors.
